- 4. Read **Colossians 1:16**. Why do you think it is important to acknowledge that God is our Creator when we consider our purpose in life?
- 5. Read **Romans 11:36**. How would your thinking need to change if you were to thoughtfully consider the "from," "through" and "to" aspects of this verse in your everyday activities?
