- Read Revelation 18:1-24. How does the contemplation of the end of worldly governments serve to adjust your view of them?
- 2. Read **Daniel 1:1-21**. How does this opening episode of what would become Daniel's extended role in the successive political cabinets of Nebuchadnezzar's Babylon through Cyrus' Persia, illustrate the challenges of godly people in political life?
- 3. Read 1 Peter 2:13-17 and 3:13-17 and 4:14-16. How do you imagine the Christians Peter is addressing went about applying these sets of instructions, knowing that much of the suffering and insults Peter and his congregation faced came as a result of the sinful, anti-Christian government under which they lived?
- 4. Read **Titus 3:1-8**. What types of Christian "good works" do you believe set the most impressive example of Christianity for our secular leaders?
- 5. Read **1 Timothy 2:1-4**. Knowing this has been a repeated application point throughout this series, what have you done (or will you do) to increase the time and effort you spend on praying for your government leaders?
