Application Questions

These questions are provided for your further study and application of today's sermon. Thoughtfully writing out the answers to these questions will help to drive home the point of today's study. It is also helpful when you are able to discuss your answers with others.

- 1. Read **Exodus 20:3** and **Ezekiel 14:3**. While we may picture "idols" as a little metallic statues, clearly the timeless problem of "God-rivals" is a battle which takes place in one's heart. What are some modern-day "idols" that people serve as supreme in their lives?
- 2. Read **Matthew 6:19-33**. Of course we all have to earn money to pay the bills and provide for our families, but how would you describe the shift that moves us into the category of "serving money" (v.24) and failing to "seek first the kingdom of God and his righteousness" (v.33)?
- 3. Read **Daniel 3:14-18**. Though today in America we may not be thrown into a literal "fiery furnace" for disobeying or disappointing people for the sake of our ultimate priorities, there can still be plenty of unpleasant consequences. List a few.
- 4. Read Acts 5:27-29. Obviously there are times when the directives of a parent, a boss, or a government (or even the expectations of a friend, a spouse, or a culture) cannot be accommodated because they are a violation of what God's word commands. Describe the skill of refusing to compromise without being needlessly insolent.
