- 3. Read Proverbs 23:4-5 and Ecclesiastes 2:1-11. What personal examples could you provide to demonstrate that material wealth makes for a lousy god?
- 4. Read 1 Timothy 6:9. What are some of the significant crossroads that professing Christians face when desiring to be rich and please God? In what practical situations do these commitments come into conflict, and often turn out to be the kinds of ruinous spiritual decisions spoken of in this passage?
- 5. Read 2 Timothy 2:4. In what way does this military analogy help you to grasp the proper biblical mindset about the subject of this weekend's sermon?
