Application Questions

As you read it, what "dreams" or "aspirations" are implied which must be given up (vv.34-35), especially in light of the comparison made in v.36?
- 2. Read **1 John 2:15-17**. List some examples for each of these three categories (listed in the middle of v.16) that are often aspired to or achieved by means of increasing amounts of money?
- 3. Read **1 Corinthians 3:18-20**. In light of the stern words of Christ in Luke 16:15, what are some of the ways you need to be ready to be considered a fool if you aim at life goals that are important to God?

4. Read **Romans 12:2**. What practical steps can you take to live out the instructions of this important verse?

5. Read **Psalm 52:7-9**. How does this passage help you appreciate the importance of maintaining a heart with a distinct set of values and priorities?
