4. Read **Isaiah 53:1-12**. After reading this prophetic text of the Old Testament, what strikes you about the price of our forgiveness? What can you do to maintain a proper view of Christ's costly love in light of the seriousness of sin?

5. Read **Psalm 32:1-7**. Describe the sort of disposition that should characterize those who understand their salvation as it is understood in this psalm?
