- 3. Read **2 Corinthians 5:17-20**. Why is imploring people to be reconciled to God so much more costly for us than simply working hard to live distinctively Christian?
- 4. Read **1 Thessalonians 2:1-4**. Why is that last line in v.4 so important for us to keep in mind? How does God's current knowledge and future evaluation of your motives impact your decisions as Christ's ambassador?
- 5. Read **2 Corinthians 2:14-17**. How can you maintain a more optimistic view of this weekend's topic, which often generates so much trepidation for Christians?
