Why do you think the benefits of a unified fellowship like the one we studied in Acts 4 doesn't motivate God's people to pray and work for unity more than they do?
- 5. Read 2 Corinthians 9:10-12. What specifically will you do this week to utilize some of what God has generously provided for you so that you will be a blessing to those in your church?
